Drive Federal Product Sales with National Stock Numbers

Federal agencies, particularly the Department of Defense, use National Stock Numbers (NSNs) to buy and manage billions of dollars of supplies each year. NSNs simplify the federal acquisition process for items that are frequently purchased.

According to the Defense Logistics Agency, NSNs provide logistics managers, procurement personnel, operations planners, and industrial base assessment personnel with a standard method of purchasing, and tracking items of supply in-storage, in-process, in-transit, and in-theater.

The BioPreferred Program Catalog allows you to list the NSN for each product and variation, making it easily searchable and recognizable by government buyers.

Since our current Audit is live until November 1st, now is the ideal time to validate the accuracy of your company's product information in our online Catalog and add NSNs to your listing.

What's an NSN?

An NSN is a code that is applied to an item that is purchased and used repeatedly throughout the federal supply system. The 13-digit unique code is assigned to a supply item that can be repeatedly stocked, stored and issued throughout the system. There are more than 6 billion NSNs which describe items in de tail. The Department of Defense provides a guide to <u>NSNs</u>.


Update Your Account

The audit can be completed in three easy steps:

- 1. **Log-in** with your username and password at <u>www.biopreferred.gov</u> under the "Tools" tab. If you are unable to log in to your account at www.biopreferred.gov, please follow the instructions in the <u>Account Access Tutorial</u> to regain access to your account or to create a Login.gov account. The USDA made the switch from eAuthorization to Login.gov on September 1, 2024. All users with an eAuth account will need to create a Login.gov account to access their company and product information.
- 2. **Confirm** your company details and contact information. Confirm that your biobased product is still being manufactured and verify that the formulation has not changed. You can complete the audit at any time while the audit window is open, between now and November 1st.
- Submit the information once you have made all your updates. You will receive confirmation that the audit was successfully completed and will be contacted by BioPreferred Program Staff if needed.

You must make all changes and **complete the audit by November 1st, 2024**. Products belonging to companies that do not participate in this audit will be marked with a bold red disclaimer in our online catalog noting that the product information may be out of date.

In Case You Missed It!

USDA Announces Enhanced Resources to Support Businesses Interested in Federal Procurement Opportunities

USDA announced resource enhancements designed to simplify and streamline access to contracting information for businesses interested in selling their products and services to USDA. These substantial updates include the addition of new and targeted contracting information on USDA.gov, along with improved functionality that makes it easier for businesses and individuals to quickly find and access procurement opportunities, and a portal for businesses to share the scope of their capabilities with USDA more easily.

"Doing business with the U.S. Department of Agriculture should be straightforward, particularly for our nation's small businesses," said Agriculture Deputy Secretary Xochitl Torres Small. "Unfortunately, researching and identifying relevant procurement opportunities can be extremely challenging, confusing, and time-consuming. That's why the Biden-Harris Administration is announcing new tools and resources that will make it easier to contract with the USDA to serve American farmers and all of us who count on the food they grow."

Spearheaded by USDA's <u>Office of Contracting and</u> <u>Procurement</u> (OCP) in collaboration with the <u>Office of Small</u> <u>and Disadvantaged Business Utilization</u> (OSDBU), these improvements include:

• The creation of a new "<u>Contracting with USDA</u>" site that offers information, resources, and links for businesses that want to contract with USDA, in a helpful Q&A format. The site addresses commonly asked questions such as "What does USDA typically buy?", "What are the most common ways USDA buys what it needs?" and "How do I find current opportunities to contract with USDA?"

Just a Reminder!

Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) mandates direct federal agencies to purchase biobased products whenever feasible. These requirements apply across procurement methods, including contracts and ecommerce.

If you are a biobased product manufacturer or vendor, these enhanced resources by USDA will make it easier for you to find opportunities to sell your biobased products to agencies in need or their federal contractors.

Coming Soon...

Within the next few weeks, the BioPreferred Program will debut a new training video that provides instructions on how to use SAM.gov to identify recently awarded contracts, so that participants can identify opportunities and attempt to sell their products to winning federal contractors.

- An updated <u>Vendor Capability Submission Portal</u> that allows suppliers and merchants to submit their business capabilities to USDA via a web form. Portal submissions are shared with contracting officers across the Department.
- Updates to the previously deployed USDA Procurement Forecast, a tool that assist businesses and individuals with identifying procurement opportunities with USDA. Launched in June 2023, the Procurement Forecast now has a user-friendly way to search and filter procurement opportunities. Currently, the tool includes nearly 6,000 planned contract opportunities for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024.

Government Requires Cleaning Products for Federal Buildings to be Free of "Toxic Chemicals"



In a move aimed at better protecting the health of custodial staff, federal employees, and the environment, the Biden-Harris Administration is directing government contractors to purchase cleaning products for federal buildings that are free of toxic "forever chemicals." Based on the <u>directive</u>, federal agencies must prioritize the purchase of sustainable products without added per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). The change is reflected in the General Service Administration (GSA) custodial specifications.

GSA's Public Building Service alone, has more than 600 contracts for custodial services at more than 1,500 U.S. government-owned buildings—at a cost of more than \$400 million per year. GSA expects most of these contracts to include the new specifications, and that other federal agencies will also adopt these specifications for their janitorial contracts.

Given these changes, you will now be prompted to indicate if there are "intentionally added PFAS" in your products whenever you submit or update your product's information in our BioPreferred Program Catalog. If federal procurement professionals searching for cleaning products free of toxic chemicals can find your listing in our Catalog, you'll be well-positioned to drive more sales and enable agencies to reduce their use of PFAS in federal buildings.
